THE INDIVIDUALS BEING HONORED ARE:

Robert Bateman, Class of 1954. Robert was an outstanding two sport athlete excelling in football and baseball. In football he was an outstanding halfback and a standout defensive end on the Group II Championship team that went 8 - 1 that year and amassed 234 points while allowing only 57. There lone loss was to the powerful Woodbury team. In baseball he was an outstanding outfielder and one of the team's leading hitters. Following high school, he entered the U.S. Air Force and served as a jet mechanic assigned to the Strategic Command. While serving in the military, he played baseball for teams in Lawton, Okla. and Abilene, Texas. Following his discharge he continued to participate in sandlot baseball as a member of teams in Vineland and Philadelphia. He recently retired from the Philadelphia Navy Yard as an air conditioning, refrigeration technician. He and his wife, Melanese, reside in Glassboro. Their five children, Tim, Steve, Dave, Robert and Kim were all graduates and athletes at Glassborò High School.

JAMES MOORE, Class of 1955. Bubby was a rugged two way lineman and a three year starter for the Bulldogs. In his sophomore year he led the team in tackles for the Group II Champions and was a Co-Captain in his senior year. He was known for his agressive blocking and relentless pursuit as a defensive lineman. He is presently a service supervisor for Sears Automotive in Deptford, where he has been employed for 34 years. Jim is following in his late father's footsteps, James Sr., an outstanding football player in the thirty's, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1993. Jim and his wife, Louise, reside in Williamstown.

CRAIG HARPER, Class of 1963. Craig was an excellènt three sport performer, in football he was a fine offensive back often assigned to lead all S.J. back Russell Snead in to the holes and helping his team to a 6 - 3 record his senior year. He was a two year starter on both the basketball and baseball teams. Craig graduated from Glassboro State College and has coached football at Clearview, Washington Twp. and Pitman. He is presently a teacher and head boys basketball coach at Pitman High School.

RUSSELL SNEAD, CLASS OF 1963. While Craig Harper was the blocking back, Russell Snead was the Saturday hero, he was the leading scorer for two years and was named to the All South Jersey Group I team his senior year. Russell also competed on the track team and was an outstanding performer in the 440 yd run and the long jump. He furthered his football career and was an outstanding performer for Grove City College and was the leading scorer, the leader in total yards gained and the leader in pass receptions for their 1966 undefeated team. In addition, he earned 1st team All Western Penna. honors and received the "Sportsman Award" from Omicron Delta Kappa. He was the President of his class and earned a B.S. degree in accounting. Following graduation, he was commissioned a 2nd Lt. in the U.S. Air Force and served as a pilot in Vietnam. Upon his discharge with the rank of Captain he joined Eastern Air Lines as a pilot and later worked for Pan American Airways. He is currently a Captain for Trans Air Airlines and resides in Miami, Florida with his wife, Pat and their two children, Tiffany and Kai. Kai is a member of the Wake Forest football team.

CAROL SUE LYNCH, CLASS OF 1976. Carol Sue was also a fine three sport performer and was outstanding in field hockey earning four varsity letters, two All Conference honors, was all South Jersey all Groups and was the South Jersey Offensive player of the year. Her team won the state title in 1975. She still holds the school record for career goals, 76. In basketball she was the point guard and the team's most valuable player and she earned three varsity letters in track. Carol currently resides in Trinity, North Carolina.

DEBORAH THORNTON MATHIS, CLASS OF 1977. Debbie was an outstanding performer in track and field, throwing the discus and javelin. She set the school record in the discus with a throw of 95'8.5". She helped lead the girls to the Olympic Conference Championship that year and won numerous honors in the local meets. She continued her track efforts at Gloucester County College where she threw the discus and the javelin. Her performance earned her a trip to the Junior College Track & Field Championships in Eugene, Oregon, she placed 10th in the National meet. She is presently a homemaker and resides in Glassboro with her son, Mickell.

MARVA BELL SLAUGHTER, CLASS OF 1978. Vicky was an outstanding record setting performer in track and field participating in the sprints, relays and long jump. Her relay team set records in the 100 yd and 200 yds races and she held the record for the long jump. Her teams won back to back Olympic Conference Championships in 1977 and 78. Vicky attended Gloucester County College and was a member of their track team again competing in the sprints and relays. In 1980, she was named the Most Valuable Performer for the college. She currently resides in Richmond, Virginia with her husband, Andrea and their three children. She is employed by the Continental Cable Vision Company of Virginia.

TANJIA PERRY, CLASS OF 1984. Tanjia was one of the finest three sport athletes at Glassboro earning All Conference honors in field hockey, basketball and track. She was an offensive leader in hockey helping her team to a 10 - 4 - 5 record and a second place finish in the Conference. In basketball she scored a career total of 735 and probably as many rebounds. But it was in track that she stood out. She still holds three school records, the 400m record of 61.8 seconds, the 400H at 1.08.03 seconds and the 100LH at 15.6. She earned All South Jersey Group I in track. Her efforts earned her a scholarship to a Virginia college and she currently resides in Hampton, Virginia with her son.

RUTH LOCKBAUM, CLASS OF 1986. Ruth was the premier long distance runner ever at Glassboro High School. She currently holds school records in the 800M, the 1600M and the 3200M. Her time in the 800M of 2.10.9 is still listed as one of the best times in New Jersey. She earned All State honors for her performances. Ruth earned a full scholarship to Villanova University. But Ruth's real claim to fame was when her picture of her hugging President Reagan at the graduation exercises made the front page of the New York Times. Ruth currently resides in Glassboro.
