We will use the funds to ensure that our space is optimized, that we have the right equipment for the types of scenarios presented to us by COVID-19, and to deliver activities and programming to students who need it most coming out of the pandemic.

We continue to solicit feedback at all board meetings; the superintendent regularly monitors a suggestion box, and we continually survey all stakeholders. We hold Parent Advisory Councils at each school. This has equipped us with information on how we can better service all of our students, particularly those listed in the above question: we will continue to provide before and after school tutoring, opportunities for students to participate in new clubs, and offer new, hands on classes that were otherwise impossible during the shutdown of 2019-2020 and hybrid instruction during 2020-2021.
