HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND BULLYING

The Glassboro Board of Education has adopted a comprehensive policy on harassment, intimidation and bullying as prescribed by New Jersey's Public Law 2010, Chapter 122, known as the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights. The intent of this law and Glassboro Board of Education policy is to ensure positive school climates that promote civility, respect, and caring. Under the Board of Education policy, harassment, intimidation or bullying is defined, in part, as "any gesture, any written, verbal or physical act, or any electronic communication that is reasonably perceived to be motivated by either any actual or perceived characteristic such as race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, or a mental, physical or sensory disability." The law and policy cover incidents of harassment, intimidation and bullying that occur on school grounds, at school-sponsored functions, on school buses, and off school grounds (as in the case of electronic communications) when those acts substantially disrupt or interfere with the orderly operation of the school or the rights of other students. Glassboro School District has appointed a District Anti-Bullying Coordinator and a School Anti-Bullying Specialist in each of our five schools. CURRICULUM

Glassboro Public School District provides a comprehensive educational program by developing a standards-based curriculum built on best-practice, research, and study in all academic areas. We strive to implement the highest caliber programs, curricula, and assessments to cultivate a love of learning in our students and to prepare them for college and careers.

In 2020, New Jersey revised its latest set of state standards, known as "The New Jersey Student Learning Standards." These standards define general, cross-disciplinary expectations that must be met for students to be prepared to enter college and training programs. These specific standards define end-of-year expectations and a cumulative progression designed to enable students to meet college and career readiness expectations no later than the end of high school. Students advancing through the grades are expected to meet each year's grade-specific standards.

Our district aims to meet and exceed these standards. Our curriculum is built around disseminating rigorous, content-knowledge rich, student-centered curriculum in grades prekindergarten through 12. We work with our teaching and support staff to provide the very best professional development, equipping staff with the necessary tools to deliver high-quality instruction to our students. We collaborate with building administrators to create a system of professional evaluation aimed at increasing our collective capacity to implement highly-effective teaching strategies. We offer a wide variety of programs and services to help students achieve their personal, educational, and career goals. The district provides full-day prekindergarten and kindergarten, gifted and talented instruction, assistance for children in need of academic support, and bilingual programs. Enrichment and remedial instruction are available to students through after school and extended school year programs.

Glassboro supports students with special educational needs through an array of services in all grades, including prekindergarten and kindergarten. School counseling services are provided in all grades.

Our STEM and Performing Arts Academies offer advanced learning opportunities to academy students in grades seven through 12 and Rowan University Courses to many academy members in grades 11 and 12. The STEM Academy offers a Biomedical Track as well. We have also developed a Business Academy Program with Rowan.

In addition to our academies, we offer several Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs, including an Early Childhood Development program and a Music Technology program. The AVID Elective course, which provides students with the tools needed for educational success, college, and future careers, is offered to select grades at Thomas E. Bowe Middle School and Glassboro High School to give support for students as they embark on rigorous educational programming and academies. CITRS, a district-wide character initiative, will also support students and staff in their quests for continuous improvement and long-lasting success through the promotion of a positive school culture rooted in responsibility and self-awareness.

Numerous co- and extra-curricular activities provide students with a rich educational experience. Glassboro encourages parents and guardians to become actively involved in their children's education. The district offers many opportunities for community participation, including family nights, that afford families the opportunity to learn about our educational and extracurricular offerings.

Academically, our aim is to prepare students for college and careers. ANNUAL INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT NOTICE FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2023-2024

Dear Parent, Guardian, or Staff Member:

This notice is being distributed to comply with the New Jersey School Integrated Pest Management Act. Glassboro Public Schools have adopted an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Policy and have implemented an IPM Plan to comply with this law. IPM is a holistic, preventive, approach to managing pests that is explained further in the schools' IPM Policy. This policy can be found at the Board of Education office and can also be accessed online through www.gpsd.us/domain/10.

As part of the school Pest Management Plan, Glassboro Public Schools may use pesticides to control pests. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) register pesticides to determine that the use of a pesticide in accordance with instructions printed on the lable does not pose an unresonable risk to human health and development.

Nevertheless, the EPA and DEP cannot guarantee that registered pesticides do not pose any risk to human health, thus unnecessary exposure to pesticides should be avoided. The EPA has issued the statement that, where possible, persons who are potentially sensitive, such as infants, children, and pregnant women, should avoid unnecessary pesticide exposure.

The Glassboro Public Schools avoid use of any pesticide except when absolutely necessary. A licensed outside contractor is utilized for all pesticide applications. During the past year, the district has not had to use "high impact" pesticides in any buildings or on its grounds. The following low impact pesticides have been used in the buildings or on district grounds while students are not present: in buildings - Advion Ant Gel Bait, Avion Roach Gel Bait, Alpine Roach Gel Bait, Avert Dry, Catch Master Glueboards, Catch Master Monitors, Contrac Blox, Gentrol Point Source, Insecticide Dust, InVade Bio Drain, Maxforce, and Mint Wasp Spray and on district grounds - Barricade, Dimension, Dismiss, Dorado, Eagle, Escalade, Last Call, and Trupower.

As the IPM Coordinator, I maintain product labels and aterial safety sheets (when available) for each pesticide that may be used on school property. Such information is available for review by any parent, guardian, staff memeber, or student attending the school. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions about the use of pesticides by the school district, the Integrated Pest Management Policy and Plan, or the information contained in this letter.

PUBLIC USE OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

School buildings are publicly owned facilities supported by the local taxpayers. For this reason, the Board of Education makes them available to community groups when not being used by students. This is done in accordance with guidelines and policies adopted by the Board. The majority of members

of any organization using school buildings and grounds must be Glassboro residents. For more information, call 856-652-2700, ext. 6201.

SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION

Mileage Limits

Glassboro Public School District provides transportation for children who qualify according to the guidelines that follow. Transportation must be provided for all elementary students (prekindergarten through grade eight) who reside more than two miles from school, and all high school students (grades nine - 12) who reside more than two and a half miles from school. Students who live within these limits, but must walk in an area that is considered hazardous, are transported to school by the Board of Education. Exceptions are granted for children with physical problems certified by a doctor and approved by the Superintendent.

Routes and Stops

Prior to the beginning of each school year, routes are established so that vehicles will travel the roads safely and serve the largest number of students within a reasonable time. Drivers are only permitted to stop at Board-approved bus stops.

Student Responsibilities

New Jersey statute 18A:25-2 provides that the driver is in full charge of the school bus at all times and is responsible for order. The driver shall not exclude a student from the bus. If unable to manage a student, the driver will report the matter to the principal. Students must be in compliance with the following rules and regulations:

At the Bus Stop

- -Be on time at your bus stop. Plan to arrive 10 15 minutes early.
- -Remain on the curb at least three feet back from the road.
- -Show respect for private property.
- -Avoid crowding or pushing as the bus approaches.
- -Wait until the bus stops before moving toward the door.
- -NEVER STAND IN THE ROAD. Do not move into the road as the bus approaches.

While On The Bus

- -Move quickly to your seat.
- -DO NOT STAND or move from your seat while the bus is in motion.
- -Do not change your seat.
- -The driver or principal may assign seats.
- -Obey the driver promptly.
- -No fighting or pushing.
- -Do not talk with or distract the driver.
- -Do not open or close windows without the driver's permission.
- -Keep hands and all parts of your body inside the bus at all times.
- -Do not eat or drink on the bus.
- -Students are responsible for any damage they cause to the bus.
- -Obey bus safety patrol members.

While on The Bus-continued

- -In case of emergency, remain in your seat until instructions are given by the driver.
- -Learn how to evacuate your bus quickly.
- -Do not litter on the bus.
- -Never throw anything out of the bus window.
- -Be courteous; talk softly.
- -Do not use any profane or obscene language.
- -Report any damage to the bus to the driver.


Getting Off The Bus

- -Move quickly away from the side of the bus.
- -Move onto the curb or off the roadway.
- -To cross the street or roadway, move 10 feet in front of the bus, wait for the driver's signal to cross, and then move rapidly to the other side.
- -NEVER GO BEHIND THE BUS TO CROSS THE STREET.

Parent Responsibilities

The transportation regulations and the policies adopted by the Board of Education should be stressed with your children, not only for their own safety, but for the protection of all students riding the school bus. As per District Policy 8603, the parent (guardian) or a designated adult must be at the bus stop when Prekindergarten through Grade 3 students are embarking or disembarking the bus.

If a parent finds that the bus service is not satisfactory, please notify the Transportation Office (856-652-2700, ext. 6701). If your child leaves something on the bus, please call the Transportation Office. The lost article will be traced, and you will be contacted if it is found.



Here are some recommendations to help ensure a safe school bus transportation system:

- -Help your child to be on time at the bus stop. We recommend arriving 10 15 minutes early.
- -Don't ask the driver to stop at places other than the designated stop.
- -Assume responsibility for educating your child to cooperate with the bus driver.
- -Insist on correct behavior while waiting for and riding on the bus.
- -Accompany a very young child to the bus stop and meet the bus when the child returns.
- -Cooperate with the school officials in discharging discipline requirements in support of a safe transportation system. Parental support in this matter is extremely important.
- -Send a note to school the day before a child expects to bring a large project on the bus.
- -Service animals are the only animals permitted on the bus.



SCHOOL BUS TRANSPORTATION - continued

Motorist Responsibilities: Stopping for School Bus

If you are approaching or overtaking a school bus and it shows a flashing red light, signaling a stop, you must follow these guidelines.

- Stop at least 25 feet away. This is required by law if you are on a two-lane road. It also applies if you are on a multilane highway where lanes are only separated by lines.
- Slow down to 10 miles per hour on a dual highway, if you are on the other side of a safety island or raised median.
- When a school bus has stopped directly in front of a school to pick up or discharge children, you may pass from either direction at a speed of no more than 10 mph.
- School buses are equipped with amber and red flashing lights. The amber flashing lights go on 300 feet before the bus stops, followed by the red flashing lights when it has stopped. You cannot always depend on these signals. Stop, watch for children, and then proceed slowly and with caution. After a stop proceed with care when all school bus signals are turned off.
- School buses stop for railroad crossings. The buses will use the far right lane or shoulder and may activate directional signals to communicate their intentions to other motorists. School buses will not use their amber or red flashing lights when stopping for railroad crossings.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSING INFORMATION

During the winter months, ice and snow may result in school closings, delayed openings, or early dismissals. A decision to close the schools is made for the safety of your children and is usually made early in the morning. It is not necessary to call the schools. Students and parents will be notified by phone starting at approximately 6:30 a.m. The information will also appear on our website, www.gpsd.us. Announcements may be made on KYW News Radio's website, https://kywnewsradio.radio.com/schoolclosings, KYWTV Channel 3, and 6ABC WPVITV Channel 6. Those schools closed in the morning will remain closed for all activities scheduled that day and evening. School Closing Numbers (if used): 805 (schools closed), 5815 (two-hour delay)

NOTE REGARDING EVENTS

Events and event formats may periodically change. Your child's school can provide information when that occurs.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Children eligible to enroll in Glassboro Public Schools must be 3 years of age on or before October 1. Parents/guardians can register their child through the online registration system available at www.gpsd.us. Registrants should upload/attach requested registration documents during that process.

IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

Minimal State Code Requirement for Immunization of Pupils in School (Chapter 14, NJ State Sanitary Code) and N.J.A.C. 8:57-4:

Diphtheria, Tetanus, acellular Pertussis (DTaP) Vaccine - Every child less than 7 years of age shall have received a minimum of four doses of Diphtheria and Tetanus, and acellular Pertussis vaccine (DTaP) with one dose given on or after child's fourth birthday OR any 5 doses. For children 7 years of age or older, a minimum of three doses of DTaP-containing vaccine is required. For children enrolled in pre-kindergarten programs, a minimum of four doses is required. Every child who is entering grade six AND who is at least 11 years of age, shall have received one dose of Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis (Tdap) given no earlier than the 10th birthday.

Poliovirus Vaccine - Every child in kindergarten and above shall have received at least three doses of polio-containing vaccine with one dose being given on/after the child's fourth birthday OR any four doses. For children ages 7 or older, any three doses will satisfy the requirement. For children in prekindergarten programs, a minimum of three doses of a polio-containing vaccine is required.

Measles, Mumps, and Rubella Vaccine - Every child in kindergarten and above shall have received one dose of Measles, Mumps and Rubella Vaccine (MMR). A second dose of measles-containing vaccine (preferably MMR) is also required. Both doses shall have been administered on or after the child's first birthday. A minimum of 30 days is required between doses. For children in prekindergarten programs, a minimum of one dose of MMR vaccine is required.

Haemophilus Influenza type b (HIB) Vaccine - Every child from 12 months to 59 months of age attending a prekindergarten class shall have received at least one dose of HIB Vaccine given on/after the first birthday.

Hepatitis B Vaccine - Every child in kindergarten and above shall have received three doses of Hepatitis B Vaccine. An approved two-dose adolescent vaccine is available at 11-15 years of age.

Varicella Vaccine - A minimum of one dose of Varicella Vaccine given on or after the first birthday or proof of disease immunity will be required for children in all grade levels. (Written statement of past history of varicella disease is also acceptable.)

Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine (PCV) - Every child 12 months through 59 months of age shall have received at least one dose of PCV on or after the first birthday.

Influenza Vaccine - Children 6 months through 59 months of age shall annually receive at least one dose of Influenza Vaccine between September 1 and December 31 of each year. Students 6 months through 59 months of age and entering school after December 31 up until March 31 must receive one dose of influenza vaccine.

Meningococcal Vaccine - Every child entering grade six AND who is at least 11 years of age, shall have received one dose of a meningococcal-containing vaccine, such as the medically preferred Meningococcal Conjugate Vaccine, given no earlier than 10 years of age.

COVID-19 Vaccine - Not required at this time, but approved for all school-aged children. Please forward COVID-19 vaccination records to the school nurse as soon as possible, so accurate immunization records can be maintained.

Laboratory Evidence of Immunity - is accepted for some vaccine-preventable diseases, as specified by the New Jersey Department of Health. Copy of lab test is required for school medical record. Please contact school nurse for more information.

Provisional Admission - To be eligible for provisional admission, students must have at least one dose of each required vaccine and be actively in the process of completing each vaccination series.

30 Day Grace Period - Applies to out of state or out of country transfer students. The student shall be admitted temporarily for up to 30 days if applicable evidence of vaccinations is not available. Child will be unable to attend school after 30 days if acceptable vaccination evidence has not been provided.

Physical Examinations - Each student must present documentation of a current physical examination upon initial enrollment into the school district. Physical Exams must be completed no earlier than one year prior to start of the school year. Physical examinations completed upon entry into another New Jersey school district may also be accepted.

Exemptions - A student is not required to have immunizations which are medically contraindicated. Written medical exemption for valid medical contraindications, as stated by the American Academy of Pediatrics, is required from the student's licensed medical provider. A student may also be exempted upon receipt of a signed, written objection that the proposed immunizations interfere with the student's religious practices.

Permissions to Give Medication at School - Glassboro School District requires that parents/guardians of students who need medication during school hours must do the following: present a written consent form signed by the parent or legal guardian, present a doctor's note for prescription and non-prescription medication, and bring the medication to school in the original prescription bottle, properly labeled by a registered pharmacist as prescribed by law.




